

Lineal Index – Notes

All the lines of the metrical psalms and the hymns have been placed in alphabetical order, in two separate sections.

Commas affect where lines are positioned, they come after words without the commas eg.

Psalms:

Where there are two versions of a metrical psalm, both are included – the version is shown using brackets after the psalm number eg.

| 89 | 3 | A covenant graciously; |
| 50(2) | 5 | A covenant have made. |
| 105 | 10 | A covenant to Israel, |
| 50(1) | 5 | A covenant with me. |

Repeated lines have generally been left in the psalms because of their length (and therefore the difficulty of finding each of the lines); when repeated lines are in close proximity, or often used, a + sign was used and the others were deleted.

Hymns:

For Hymn 938 'Come, O Thou Traveller unknown', only the second, longer version was used.

Where a line has been repeated within a hymn, then the verse number with the first use of it has a + sign against it, the others have then been deleted (differences in punctuation were ignored) eg.

Locating lines, phrases and words in Adobe:

Open the document.

*Click on **Edit** at the top of the page.*

*Then click on **Find** and a box appears.*

*Enter the line, phrase or word you are looking for and click **Next**. Keep clicking **Next** until you find what you are looking for.*

When searching for small words, other words come up with that word in it eg. if you put in 'mite' you have 'unlimited', 'smite', 'smites' and also 'mite'.
