



Rules: Christian Worship Camp 11–17

Aim: These Camp Rules aim to ensure that all campers and leaders are as happy and safe as possible, including before and after camp! The **safety** of everyone is paramount.

Motto text: “**And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ’s sake hath forgiven you.” Ephesians 4:32**

Camp rules are under continual review, in agreement with good practice everywhere, and align with our host site’s policies and terms and conditions.

1. Kindness: camp supports opportunities for kindness. One of the main ways this happens is through membership of and interactions within groups of various kinds (e.g., single-sex and age-based dorm and Bible-study groups, mixed-sex/age competitive teams). Campers will be able to mix freely much of the time but will remain in their groups for stated activities. Campers’ efforts to contribute kindly and positively to their group/team, and support inclusivity and encouragement in general on camp, will be rewarded.
2. Everyone will be involved in the daily programme - activities are designed to maximise inclusivity. However, medical reasons or unforeseen circumstances may dictate otherwise.
3. Electronic devices and photography are not permitted, except in accordance with the Camp’s Mobile Phone Policy (available on the Christian Worship website).
4. Campers will follow instructions given by camp leaders, or, within teams, their team captains.
5. Campers will remain in their dorms from 10.00pm until 7.30am the following morning (fire alarms excepted).
6. Campers will help with investigations relating to any loss or damage to our host site’s property, others’ belongings, or any act of theft or vandalism, to determine an outcome.
7. No-one will enter the chalet of a member of the opposite sex. No-one will enter the room of another guest unless invited to do so, with consent of others sharing the room. All campers will respect the privacy and personal space of others.
8. Smoking, vaping, alcohol, and any substance abuse are not permitted.
9. Breaches of these rules will be dealt with firmly, and leaders reserve the right to require individuals to leave the camp as a last resort.
